The Council of the City of Mountain Home, Elmore County, Idaho, met at Mountain Home City Hall, 160 South 3rd East, Mountain Home, Idaho on March 4th, 2021. A quorum was established with, Councilman McCain, Councilman Brennan, Councilman Stokes and Mayor Sykes being present at 5:00 P.M. Councilman Bundy was absent.

Discussion with County Commissioners for support of the Anderson Ranch Dam Water Project

Elmore County Commissioners, Bud Corbus and Crystal Rodgers were present to discuss support of the Anderson Ranch Dam Water Project.

Bud spoke to the Council Concerning the Anderson Ranch Dam Water Project. He said currently what is needed from the City is a letter of support for this project.

Councilman Bundy was present by phone at 5:05 p.m. and the meeting continued.

Commissioners Corbus and Rogers left the meeting at 5:42 p.m. when the discussion on support of the Anderson Ranch Dam Water Project had concluded.

Discussion/Decision on Request to Purchase and Installation of a QT Machine for the City Airport and Request to Proceed with having the City Fuel tank hooked up to the QT machine. ACTION ITEM.

Ted Thompson was present to discuss the purchase and installation of a QT Machine for the City Airport. Right now, the QT machine at the Airport belongs to Ted, and the City would like to have one of their own at the Airport.

Councilman Brennan said it was his understanding the City had offered Ted what it would cost to buy a new QT machine for his QT machine that is at the Airport now.

Mayor Sykes said they had actually offered more than what you could buy one for. He said if they need to buy a different QT machine there will be a three week wait to have another QT machine delivered.

Ted said he could not make a decision on whether or not he was going to sell his QT machine to the City until he knew if he would be continuing his contract with the City.

Councilman Bundy said he would like to push this discussion to the Council meeting on the 8th of March, when everyone had more time to look into the matter. He said he felt this was something that should be addressed in a regular City Council meeting rather than a Special City Council meeting.

It was decided to bring this item back to the March 8th City Council Meeting.

Councilman McCain made a motion to remove Discussion/Decision on request to purchase and installation of a QT Machine for the City Airport and Request to proceed with having the City Fuel tank hooked up to the QT machine from this agenda and place it on the March 8th City Council Meeting Agenda. Councilman Stokes seconded the motion.


The following vote was recorded:
