The Council of the City of Mountain Home, Elmore County, Idaho, met at Mountain Home City Hall, 160 South 3rd East, Mountain Home, Idaho on September 8th, 2020. A quorum was established with, Councilman McCain, Councilman Bundy, Councilman Brennan, and Mayor Sykes being present at 3:15 P.M.

Discussion/Decision on purchase of Gateway signs, placement options and conditions for easement. ACTION ITEM.

The Council discussed the purchase of gateway signs and the placement options for the signs at the various entryways to the City.

Councilman Stokes was present at 3:20 p.m. and the meeting continued.

It was decided to put the signs at the two entry points into Mountain Home that get the most traffic which are on Sunset Strip before you get to Albertson's where the Welcome to Downtown Mountain Home rock is currently placed, and on American Legion where Mayor Sykes is working out an agreement with McDonalds to have the sign placed on their property temporarily with the City paying power costs and will be moved to the middle of the traffic circle once that is completed.

Councilman McCain made a motion to approve the placement of a one-sided 10mm gateway sign on sunset strip coming into town and a two-sided 10mm gateway sign to be placed on American Legion coming into town on McDonald's property temporarily with the City paying power costs and the sign will be moved to the middle of the traffic circle once that is completed. Councilman Bundy seconded the motion.

Once there was more information on the cost of the signs and whether one of the signs could be paid for with money from the CARES Act it would be brought back to the Council for further discussion.
